IMPACT AND THE COMMUNITY FOUNDATION



In September 2011, the Public Art Endowment unveiled Standing Vase with Five Flowers by James Surls along Green Valley Road.

Dictionaries define impact as “the force exerted by a new idea, concept, technology, or ideology.”

But there’s also impact from “giving back.”

The Community Foundation’s track record as such a force is broad and far-reaching throughout our community, whether in housing, social services, the arts, health care, education or other areas of interest. Much of this is highly visible and tangible, such as new artwork springing up around town because of the **Public Art Endowment**. Other impact is not as readily recognized, perhaps, such as women returning to the workforce because of training made possible by a **\$25,000 grant from the Women to Women grantmaking fund**.

In this year’s Annual Report, we focus on the impact of not only the Foundation’s work, but also the generosity of our 500-plus fundholders, who are listed in the back. Our Board of Directors has adopted a sweeping and innovative Strategic Plan that promises to make the Foundation an even more effective force. The new Strategic Plan plots a course to lead the Foundation – and our community – to even deeper levels of involvement.

In particular, the Strategic Plan emphasizes the Foundation’s role as a convener and to growing more regionally. As part of the plan, the Foundation looks to significantly increase our financial assets and volunteer base, which in turn will enable us to leverage even greater impact on community issues and needs.

Reaching our strategic goals involves the creation of a set of task forces. First is the Civic Leadership and Community Engagement Task Force that is creating strategies to develop and grow support of broadly defined civic leadership to meet community needs and opportunities.

A second group, the Workforce Development and Financial Stability Task Force, is charged with exploring the pilot program of a unique national strategy to help CEOs of local mid-sized companies increase their economic success and develop their role in community leadership.

The third group, called Greensboro Works and convened jointly with United Way of Greater Greensboro, is working to address economic challenges by supporting strategies for promoting workforce development, family fiscal success and economic growth.

The year 2011 set the stage for an exciting new era for The Community Foundation, its fundholders and the greater Greensboro area. We are here to make a positive impact on our community and appreciate the generous support of all of those who are partnering with us.

A NOURISHING IMPACT

"I knew after I had my first child that I wanted to do something that made a big impact on children and our community," says Parker White (above, right). So she established **BackPack Beginnings**.

Started in January 2010 as a charitable purpose fund at The Community Foundation and in partnership with Guilford Child Development and Second Harvest Food Bank, BackPack Beginnings has been a huge success, providing over 600 school-aged kids at risk of hunger with backpacks full of nutritious, nonperishable, child-friendly foods to take home over the weekends during the school year. BackPack

Beginnings supplements government supported programs that only cover weekday meals. According to Guilford County School's Nutrition Office, more than 56 percent of children in our school system – about 41,000 children – receive free or reduced lunches.

Now, along with Allison Cochran (above, left), Parker has added the Comfort BackPack Program, providing annually 1,500 backpacks filled with such things as personal hygiene items, school supplies, stuffed animals, books and blankets to abused/neglected, foster, homeless and refugee children.

A DRAMATIC IMPACT

In 2011, Marge and Jake Michel converted their 18-year-old Michel Family Foundation to a donor-advised fund at The Community Foundation.

"We'd been very much in touch with The Community Foundation and had gotten to know the people there," Marge says. "Mainly, it was a way of simplifying all of the administration. Yet we are still

able to be heavily involved in our giving and involve our children, Mary, Joe and Susan."

Over the years, the Michels have been significant supporters of Children's Home Society, Triad Stage and the School of Education at UNC-Greensboro, where they recently gave \$300,000 to create a new library.

A CHANGING IMPACT

IMPACT Greensboro is a leadership program based at the Center for Creative Leadership. Founded in 2007 by The Community Foundation and Greensboro Human Relations Commission and UNC-G Center for Youth, Family and Community Partnerships, it helps ordinary citizens from different backgrounds become "change agents" for community issues.

In 2011, The Community Foundation provided nearly \$100,000 in support to IMPACT Greensboro, and The Cemala Foundation continued its role as a funding partner. As a result, 45 new change agents graduated from IMPACT, bringing its total to 360.

One of IMPACT's change agents is Andrew Trump, who coordinates the English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) program at Reading Connections, which offers free, individualized adult literacy services to promote life changes for Guilford area residents. Through IMPACT, Andrew was able to work with others who are similarly engaged and create a personal Change Action Plan to guide his work in building a better community.

"It's important to have community members who help identify important issues and set about creating solutions – not wait on others to create the community we want to live in," Trump says.

But first, she needed training to bring her up to speed on basic professional skills, interviewing tips, refinement of her resume and networking opportunities. She found all of this through the New Choices program, offered by the Women's Resource Center. In 2011, The Community Foundation's **Women to Women Endowment**

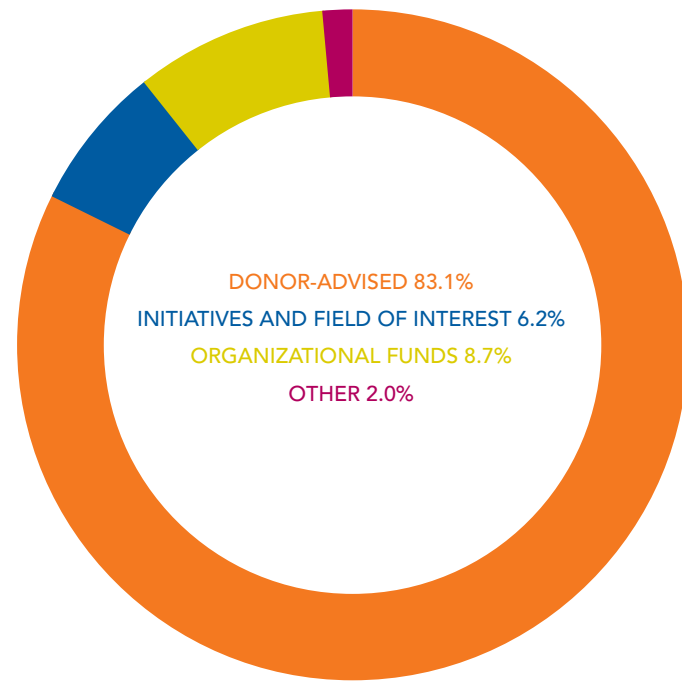
made a \$25,000 grant to New Choices. Recently, Trina started work as an on-call teller at NewBridge Bank.

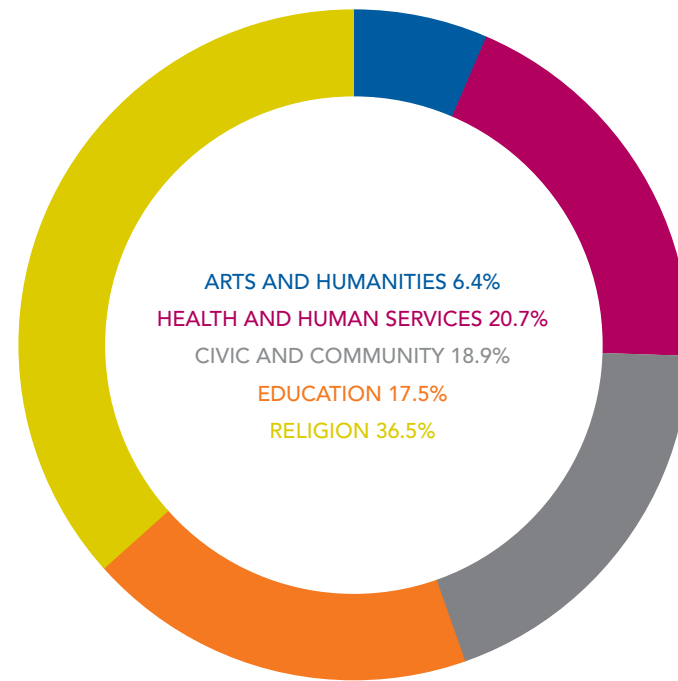

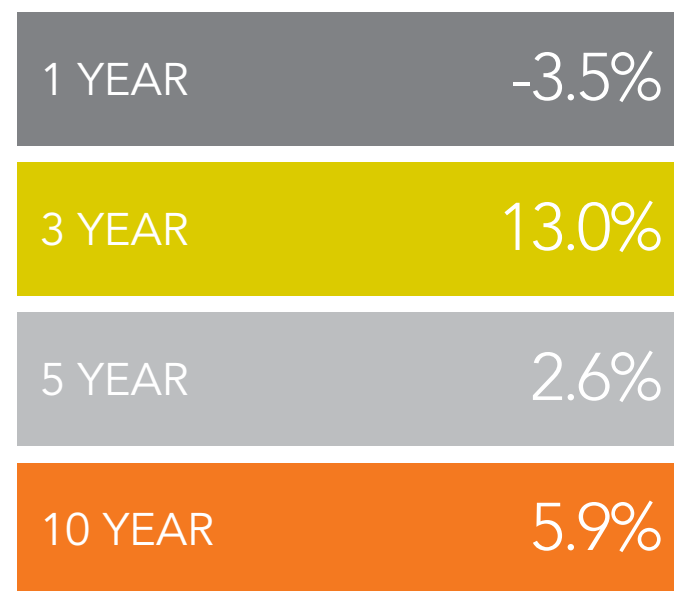
2011 CONTRIBUTIONS: \$17 MILLION



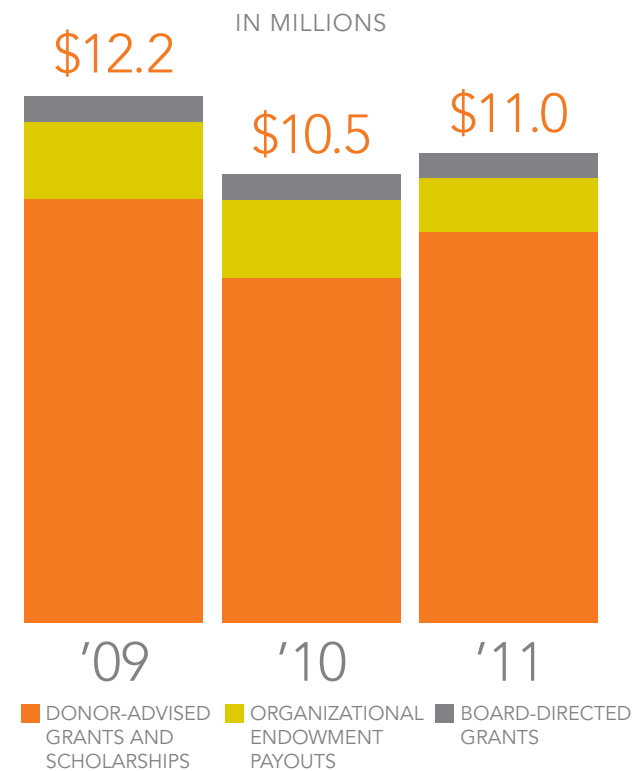
2011 GRANTS: \$10 MILLION
